Biographical Note

Mother Mary Augustine Decount was born in Philadelphia in 1786. Although details of her early life are often unknown, she was known to have a talent for music. She first met Sister Rose White (late Mother Rose White) when she led a group of Sister of Charity of St. Joseph's to manage St. Joseph's Orphan Asylum in 1814. She joined the Community in 1817, where she became a music teacher at St. Joseph's Academy in Emmitsburg. She began serving on the Council in the position of Procuratrix in 1820.

In 1825, Sister Mary Augustine began serving as the first Sister Servant at St. Vincent's School in Washington, DC, which later became both a school ad orphan asylum. Two years later, she was elected to succeed Mother Rose White as Superioress of the Community, where she served for six years. During her time in office, the Community opened 18 houses in 15 cities, expanded the curriculum of St. Joseph's Academy, and sent Sisters to serve and nurse during some of the worst cholera epidemics of the early 19th century in seaport cities. Her time in office also saw the Sisters enter new parts of the country, including the first ministries in New England, the Deep South, and west of the Mississippi River.

Upon the completion of her term of office in 1833, Mother Augustine served at St. Joseph's Orphan Asylum in Philadelphia, before being recalled to once again teach music in Emmitsburg. At the age of 60, she was missioned to Mobile, Alabama in 1847 to manage St. Mary's School and Asylum. In 1855, she began her retirement in Emmitsburg before she passed away in 1870 at the age of 84.

This collection contains materials related to the life of Mother Mary Augustine Decount and her time as Superioress of the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph's from 1827-1833. It contains several cross-reference documents to materials held in the Daughters of Charity Provincial Archives.
